




Father Tim Vakoc Dies Unexpectedly

On June 20, 2009, our dear friend and beloved Army Chaplain, Father Timothy Vakoc, died from an accidental fall while being transferred out of bed at the nursing home where he was residing. His death came very unexpectedly and as a shock to all those who knew and loved him. He was 49 years of age.

Father Tim served in the Army as chaplain from 1996 to 2004. On May 29, 2004, he was gravely wounded by an IED roadside bomb in Mosul, Iraq, suffering a severe brain injury. Father Tim received the title of Major and was awarded the Purple Heart, the Bronze Star and the Combat Action Badge for his service to our country. Since his injury the Franciscan Brothers of Peace visited Father Tim several times each week, assisting him with some of his daily activities. He became a close friend and a part of our community life (Brother Paul, fbp, has been friends with Father Tim's sister Anita Brand for the past 28 years).

"There is a great void in our life now and he will be missed dearly" said Brother Paul. He further noted that just a few days prior to Father Tim's death, Pope Benedict the XVI declared it to be the "Year of the Priest", to be celebrated throughout the Roman Catholic Church. Father Tim was indeed a great example of the priesthood today, so very worthy to go to his eternal reward in the Year of the Priest. Several of the Franciscan Brothers of Peace were privileged to be at his bedside when he died.

More than 2,000 persons, including several hundred priests and deacons, attended Father Tim's funeral on June 26, 2009, at the Cathedral and Shrine of Saint Paul, in Saint Paul, Minnesota. Archbishop John Nienstedt was principal celebrant at the Mass of Christian Burial.

Eternal rest grant unto Father Tim, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him!

M. Rev. Lee Anthony Piché New Auxiliary Bishop for Saint Paul & Minneapolis



On Monday, June 29, 2009, the Feast of Ss. Peter and Paul, in accord with ancient tradition, our good friend and Br. Paul's former seminary classmate Lee Piché was consecrated for service as Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis.

The liturgy of episcopal ordination was celebrated in the Cathedral and Shrine of Saint Paul in Saint Paul, Minnesota. Archbishop John Nienstedt presided at the liturgy. Archbishop Emeritus Harry Flynn of St. Paul and Minneapolis and Bishop John LeVoir of New Ulm co-consecrated Bishop Piché.

Bishop Piché replaces the Most Reverend Richard E. Pates, who was installed as the Bishop of the Diocese of Des Moines in May of 2008.

"I am honored and humbled by the Holy Father's confidence in me," Piché said of his appointment earlier this year as bishop–elect by His Holiness, Benedict XVI. "This is a great Archdiocese, with many blessed and talented individuals, parishes, and institutions, and with some significant challenges, too. I am grateful to God for calling me to serve in this way. Since receiving this news, I have been praying that God will strengthen me to be faithful in the ministry of bishop."

Archbishop Nienstedt said in his homily, "It is... appropriate that we gather today on this wonderful feast of these two great apostles to ordain through the laying on of hands a successor in that apostolic college. It is through this unbroken succession that the work of Our Savior continues in our own day and age."

In his remarks to the faithful, newly consecrated Bishop Piché said, "Both St. Peter and St. Paul would have been overjoyed — are overjoyed from their place in heaven as they witness this assembly here today. I hope they are happy I was ordained a bishop to succeed them and the other apostles, but I know they would be very happy to see this massive throng of believers, united with one heart and one voice."

Indeed, we unite our voices to that of the whole Church, and express our joy by proclaiming "Many Years!" to you, Bishop Piché!





Brothers Speak at 2009 National Right To Life Convention

I he Franciscan Brothers of Peace were once again asked to participate as workshop speakers at the 2009 National Right To Life Convention held at the Blake Hotel in Charlotte, North Carolina, from June 18 to 20, 2009.

Brother Paul, fbp, presented a workshop on medical advocacy and the dangers of assisted—suicide and euthanasia. He also spoke on the legacy of Terri Schiavo with Terri's brother Bobby Schindler and their work at the Terri Schindler Schiavo Foundation. Brother Paul serves as vice—chairman of the Board of Directors of the foundation. He also addressed a general session of the National Teens for Life Convention on various life issues with the theme of "Having the Courage to be Pro-Life."





Brother Pio, Brother Seraphim and our postulant Matthew Connolly also attended the event and not only had the chance to experience the convention but also to meet and collaborate with Pro-Life leaders from around the country. The brothers also had an exhibit booth at the convention and were able to meet many of the more than 1,000 people attending this year's event.

For the past four years during the summer months, as almost an extension of the national convention, the Franciscan Brothers of Peace also speak at four mini–summer camps for pro–life teens and young adults sponsored by Wisconsin Right to Life. This year Brother Pio and Brother Paul presented several workshops and participated in various camp activities.

Please continue to pray for us as we strive to defend and promote the Gospel of Life, and speak out for those who cannot defend themselves.




200 Attend 2nd Annual Donum Vitae Conference in Hankinson, ND

The second annual Donum Vitae (Gift of Life) Conference took place in Hankinson, North Dakota on May 2, 2009, at St. Francis Convent Gym. This year's conference was co–sponsored by Hankinson Chapter Right to Life and the Catholic Communities of Southeast North Dakota. The featured speakers were Bobby Schindler and Brother Paul O'Donnell, fbp, of the Terri Schindler Schiavo Foundation in St. Petersburg, Florida. Mr. Schindler spoke from the very personal position of a family member who wanted only to take care of his brain injured sister, but was not allowed to do so; Brother O'Donnell provided a moral approach to the care of disabled persons and offered positive actions we can all take to prepare ourselves for the possibility that any one could find themselves in a similar situation.

The main themes of the 3-hour conference were euthanasia, medical advocacy for vulnerable persons and the need to learn about and complete advance directives for health care. All participants were provided with two advance directive forms from the ND Catholic Conference website. Attendees indicated their appreciation of the conference and many stated that they left the conference with a corrected understanding of the five-year Schiavo case so broadly covered by the media between 2001 and 2005.



Terri Schindler Schiavo died by court-ordered starvation and dehydration on March 31, 2005.


Mr. Schindler recalled that one of the most frequently asked questions he was called to respond to during his sister's fight for life was, "Would you want to live like your sister? Would you want to be a vegetable?" He said that that is the wrong question. The question we need to ask ourselves is, "how can we love these people

who have suffered such terrible injuries?"

Organizers of this year's conference were encouraged by the attendance of a broader audience this year than last. More teenagers and more medical professionals came this year, and persons from greater distances such as Bismarck, Grand Forks, Graceville, and St. Paul, Minnesota. They hope to continue to offer similar opportunities for education for life every year and will begin planning soon for next year's conference.


